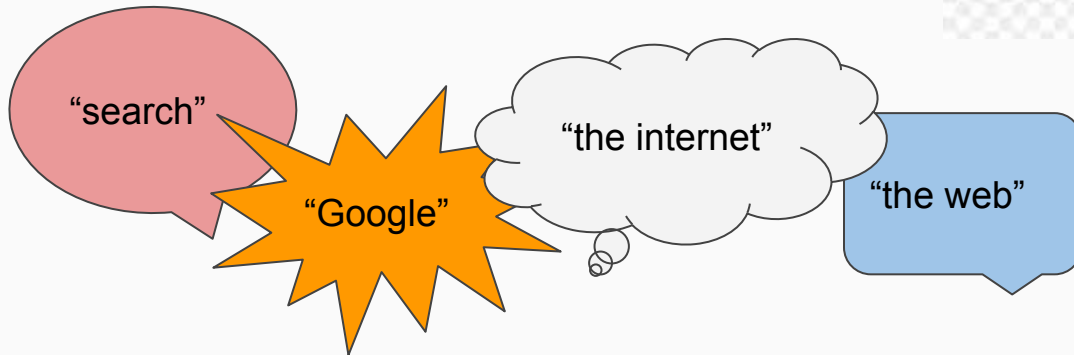

A program on your computer for looking at web pages on the Internet



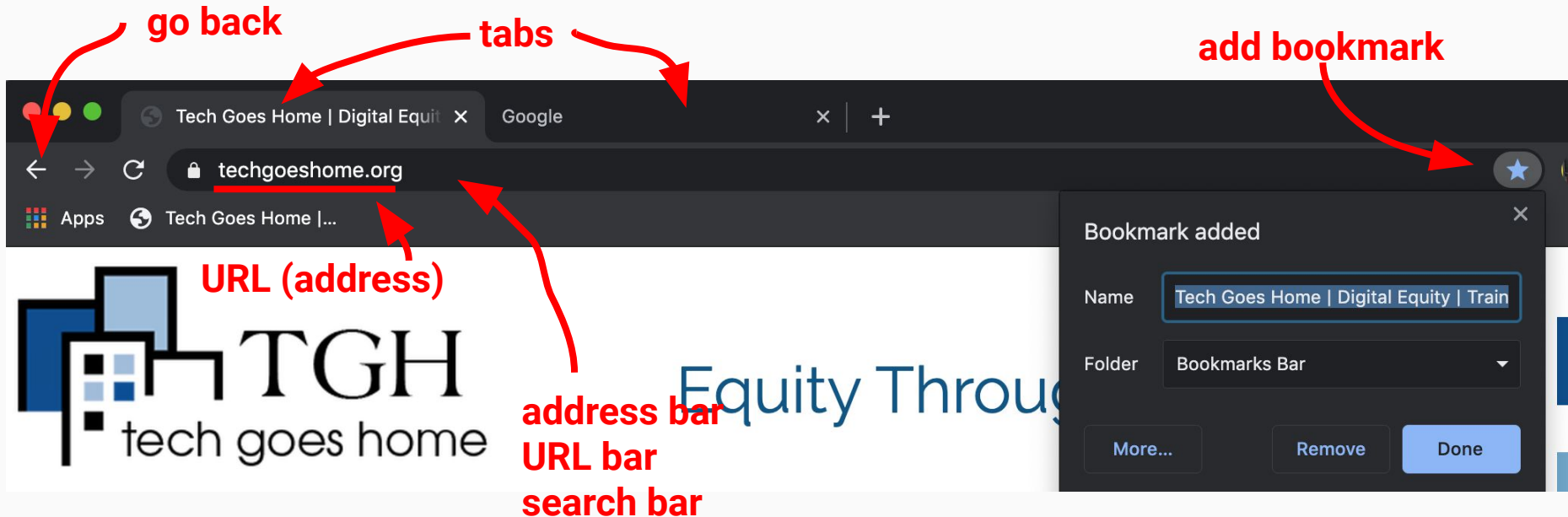

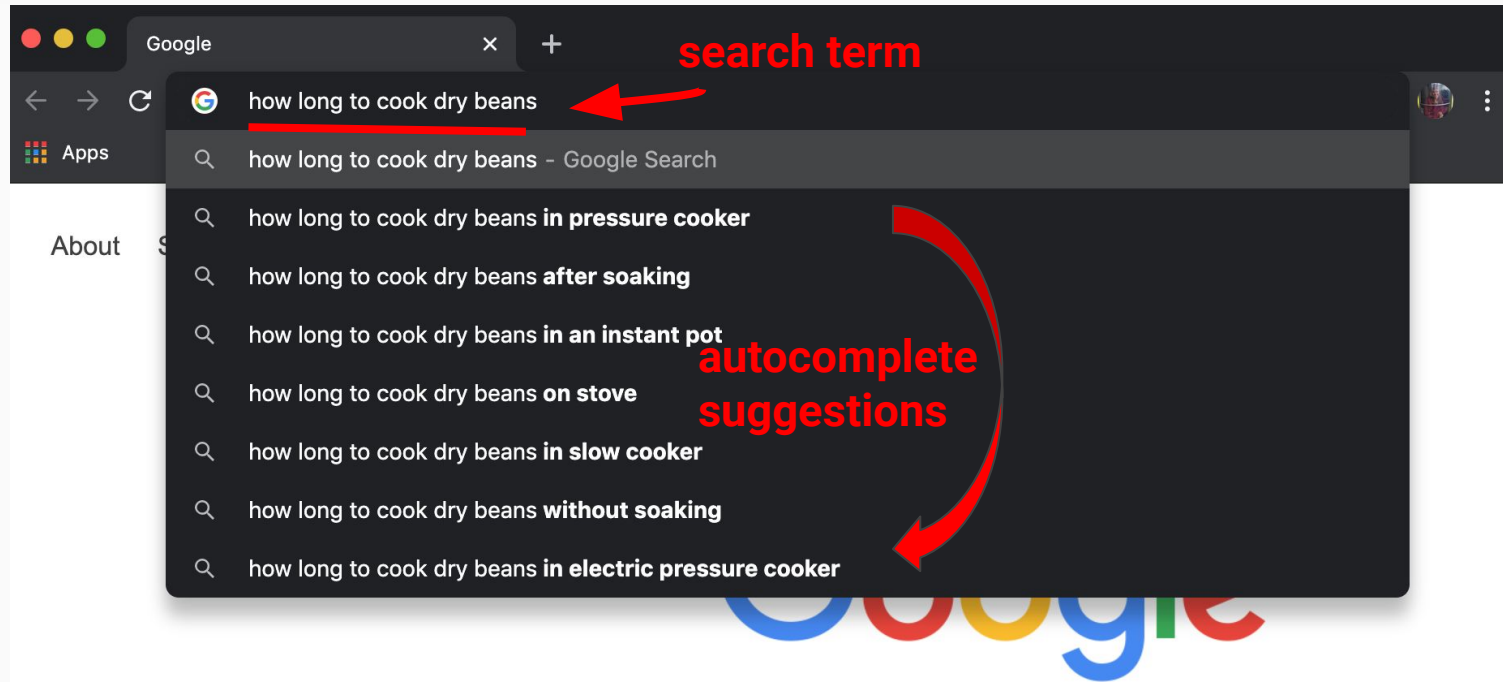

6. Check the **beans after** an hour. ...
7. Add the salt when **beans** are just barely tender. ...
8. Cool and store the **beans**.

Oct 23, 2017 - Just put those **beans** in a pot, cover them with water, bring them up to a **boil**, and then cover the pot and turn off the heat. Let them sit for at least a half an hour in the hot water, drain them, and go from there.

How to Cook Beans - NYT Cooking



Rinse well, then cover with cold water and **soak** for 6 hours or overnight. Transfer **beans** to a soup pot and add water to cover by 1 inch. Add onion, bay leaf and bacon and bring to a **boil**. Reduce heat to a bare simmer, partly cover pot with lid, and **cook** for 1 hour, stirring occasionally.

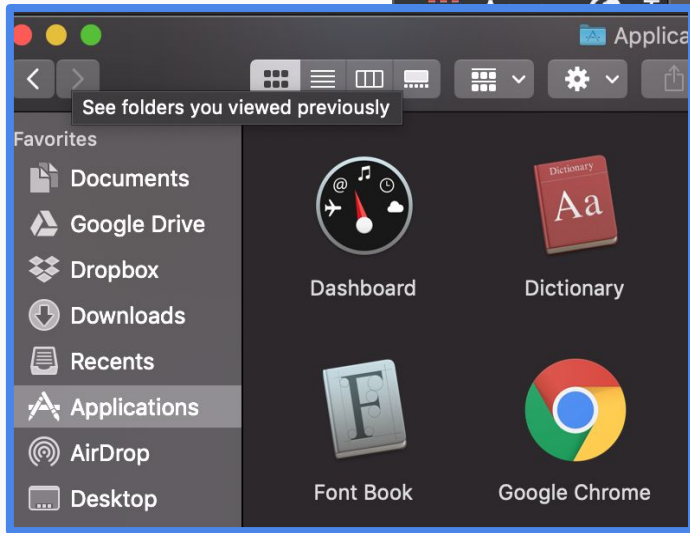
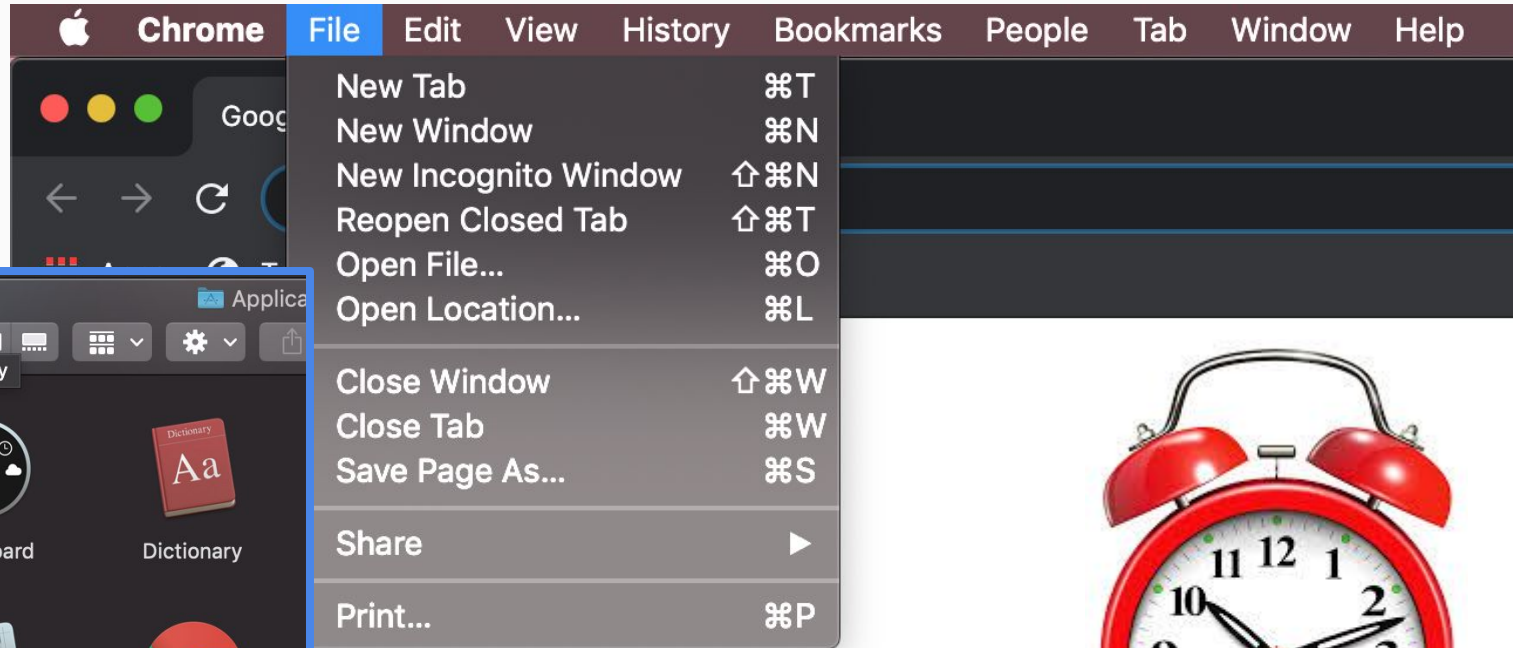

Opening Chrome, tabs, and windows



- Search for banana bread recipes
- Click on a link
- Navigate back to your search results
- Open a link in a new tab
- Use the scroll bar to scroll to the bottom of the browser window
- Close the window and return to your search results
- Open another link in a new window
- Make the text larger. Set it to the size you prefer (even if that's back to the size it was originally.)

Other exercise ideas

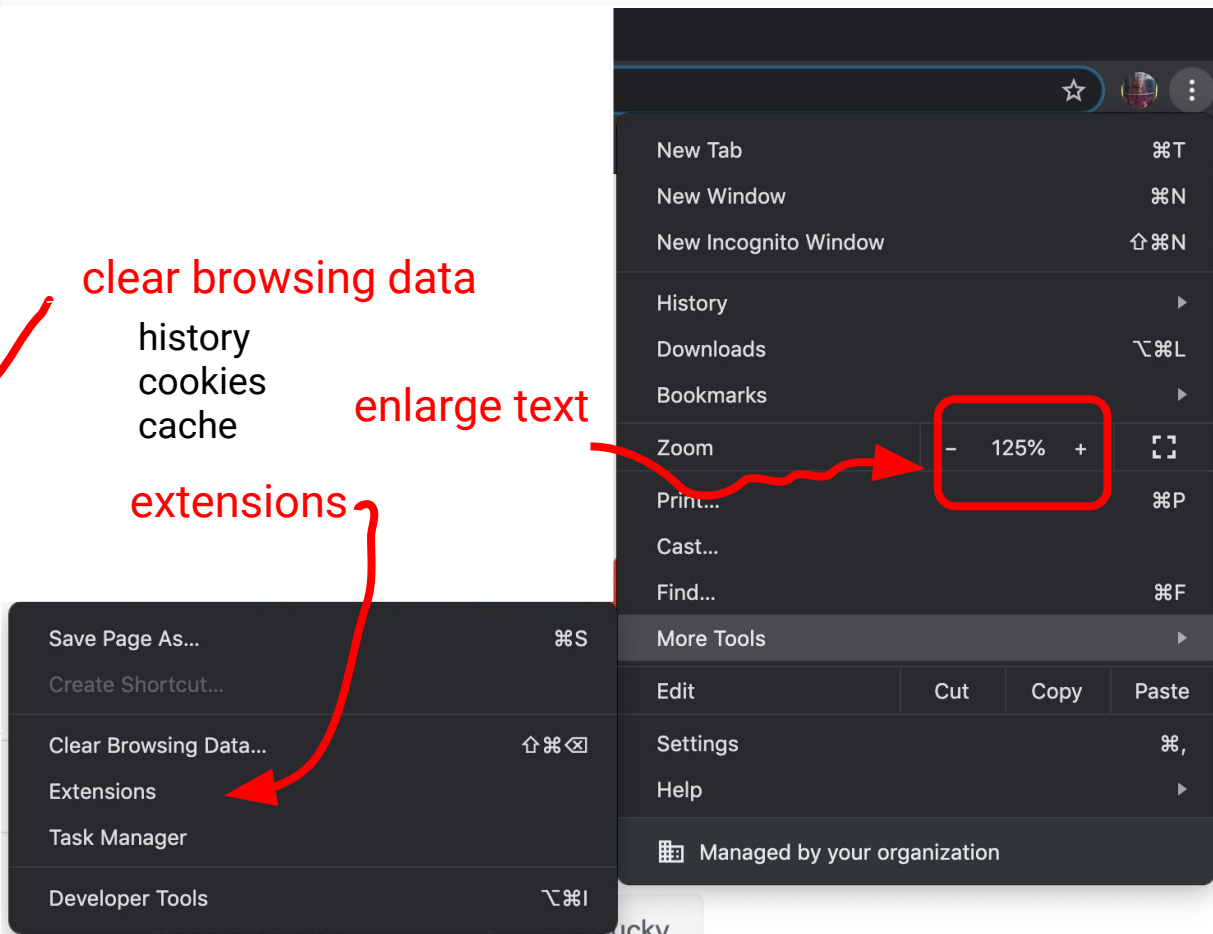
- Open another link in a new window
- Resize the window so you can see it next to your search results
- Save the window to look at later (create a bookmark).
- Open a new incognito window from your original search results
- Close Chrome

 - You can also safely use Chrome to remember your passwords
- Google Translate
- AdBlock Plus

Google Translate

- Visit translate.google.com to generate written or verbal translations
 - Over 100 languages!
- Go to any web page written in a language different than your main language settings. Chrome will offer to translate the page into another language and remember your settings.
- Use the Google translate extension to translate specific words
- Google Lens on your phone
- Leo dictionary (and likely others!)

Logging in & using incognito

- Logging in to the browser with your Google account
 - Saved passwords
 - Extensions available
 - Bookmarks
 - Browsing history
- Incognito
- Guest mode

Assessing truth and accuracy

- Not everything you read on the internet is true
- Identify trusted resources
 - New York Times
 - Mayo Clinic
 - The Guardian
 - Snopes
- Understand where the information comes from

Browser security

- Passwords
- Popup blocker
- Flash player not active by default
 - WARNING: fake flash player downloads contain malware
- Insecure site warnings
- Https safe browsing warnings
- Extension security
- Download updates automatically

When things go wrong

- I can't get the internet
- I click on a link and nothing happens
- I'm getting an error on a web page
- A web page that I expect to work is behaving strangely
