## Tech Goes Home Receives \$150,000 Grant from Patrick J. McGovern Foundation to Support Digital Equity Programming

BOSTON, February 8, 2024 – <u>Tech Goes Home</u> (TGH), a leading Massachusetts nonprofit committed to closing the digital divide, announced today that it received a \$150,000 grant from the <u>Patrick J. McGovern Foundation</u> (PJMF) to support TGH's digital skills programming and enhance outreach efforts across the Commonwealth.

Awarded in December of 2023, the grant will help TGH expand its work across Massachusetts to provide learners with a laptop or tablet, reliable internet access, and 15 hours of digital skills training. Founded in Boston, TGH partners with community-focused organizations – like schools, libraries, and nonprofits – and utilizes a network of local instructors to reach individuals and families facing barriers to digital access.

PJMF's latest commitment brings their total support for TGH to \$800,000 over three years, including their funding support in the release of TGH's groundbreaking report, <u>Developing a Digital Equity Theory of Change with Tech Goes Home</u>. Recently featured on the <u>Connected Nation</u> podcast and <u>WCVB's CityLine</u>, the report – authored in conjunction with the Digital Equity Research Center at the Metropolitan New York Library Council – focuses on creating a strong theory of change for TGH and identifying key strategies for evaluating the success of digital equity programming nationwide.
